Students are asked to request to see his/her counselor by coming into the Counseling Center and filling out the request on one of the iPads set up in the Counseling Center. Please be patient. Counselors will do their best to see students within 48 hours, but wait times may be longer.

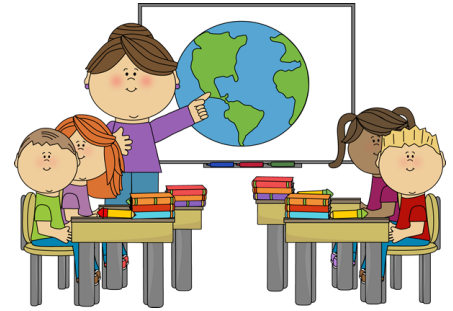

## Homeroom

Homeroom lessons take place every Monday. These lessons are geared to each age group to help students succeed in school and in the future. Lessons include programs, such as the Honor Cord requirements, anti-bully activities, CHTV News (announcements for school events and promotions), grade checks, Student Government needs (such as Homecoming and Prom royalty), Josten's graduation information, etc. Take a minute every week to ask your student about what they did in Homeroom.



## ASVB Career Testing

### The ASVB Career Exploration Program

Sophomore students will participate in the ASVB this year during their Careers class. The results of the ASVB will help students research careers that align with their personality and interests. After taking the ASVB test students will be introduced to the Career Exploration Program which will help students look for careers that interest them, including college options and tuition. In addition, students will be introduced to the [March2Success program](#), which is an ACT prep program that can be accessed at home, by students and parents.

10<sup>th</sup> grade ASVB student scores are not reported to the military. *The ASVB is also available to 11 & 12 grade students in October and March every school year. This is a free test and scores will be reported to the military.*

## PSAT Test

The PSAT test available for sophomores and juniors—This practice SAT test also allows for high test scoring (JUNIOR ONLY) students to have the chance to receive the National Merit Scholarship. # Attendance Policy 2018-19

The administration, faculty, and staff of Copper Hills High School recognize that regular attendance at school increases the opportunity for students to profit from educational programs. They also acknowledge that the Utah Compulsory Attendance Law (P.L.53-24-1) directs parents to require their children between the ages of six and eighteen to attend school every official school day.

Responsibility for regular school attendance shall be shared by the student and his/her parent or guardian.

Frequent absences disrupt the instructional process. The benefits of

instruction, once lost, cannot be regained entirely. The staff of Copper Hills makes every effort to encourage regular attendance by all students and to assist parents in their responsibility to have their children attend school.

### CHHS Administration Suggests:

1. **Attend school every day**
2. **Be on time to every class**
3. **Do your work to the best of your ability**
4. **Turn your work in on time**

When you know your student will be absent, or he/she has missed some school, or was tardy, please contact the Attendance Office by phone or in a written message. Students have up to five (5) school days to excuse an absence. After that, parents/guardians will need to fill out an appeal form.

Students planning a vacation may request a Vacation Release form, by written note or phone call, to avoid NG status for missed days.
